



SUPPORT House Bill 44: DV Orders / Repeat Violators

PROPOSAL

Strengthen the enforcement of domestic violence protective orders by reducing the number of prior convictions required to charge an offender with a Class H felony for a violation from three prior convictions to one prior conviction.

TALKING POINTS

- Violation of a domestic violence protective order is a serious crime and is a red flag to the court system that the offender may commit a homicide.
 - If we expect offenders to obey domestic violence protective orders, violations must be strictly enforced with meaningful consequences.
 - An offender who violates a domestic violence protective order not only offends the victim, but also offends the court by violating the judge's order.
 - **79** women, men, and children were murdered in NC because of domestic violence last year, and **22** women, men, and children have been killed already this year.
 - This bill can save lives.
